### The Marston Jubilee Walk

A 6.5 mile circular walk from the Millennium Country Park, Marston Moreytenne through the surrounding countryside to Hunger Hill and Rectory Wood returning via the ancient woodland of Marston Thrift.

The walk uses public footpaths and bridleways throughout and is waymarked with a Marston Jubilee Walk disc. All structures are easily accessible with no stiles to cross. Allow 2 ¾ hours to complete the promoted walk and a further hour if you decide to walk into Cranfield or explore Rectory Wood.

Sections of the walk are steep with surface conditions deteriorating during prolonged spells of rainfall, so sturdy footwear is recommended.

### Maps

The Jubilee Walk is waymarked and the leaflet does have a basic map but an Ordnance Survey map is recommended whenever venturing into the countryside. Explorer Map 192 covers the Jubilee Walk and if wishing to explore further afield then maps 193 and 208 cover the surrounding countryside.

### Facilities

The Forest Centre has ample parking, toilets and a café bar and both Marston and Cranfield have village shops and public houses.
