

Experience underground tunnel surprises and learn how public hangings used to entertain the crowds! Pub stops along the way help to steady the nerves.

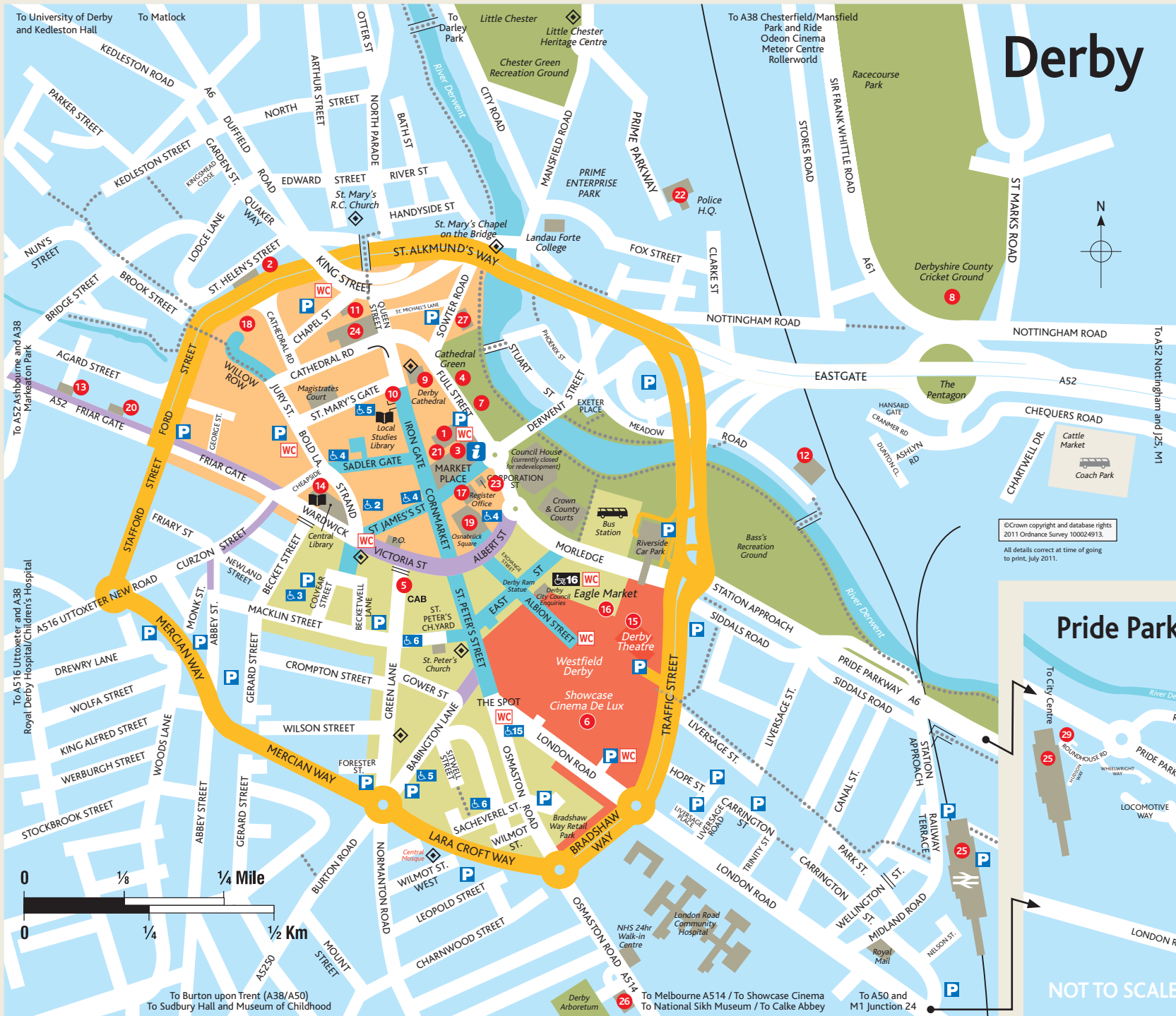

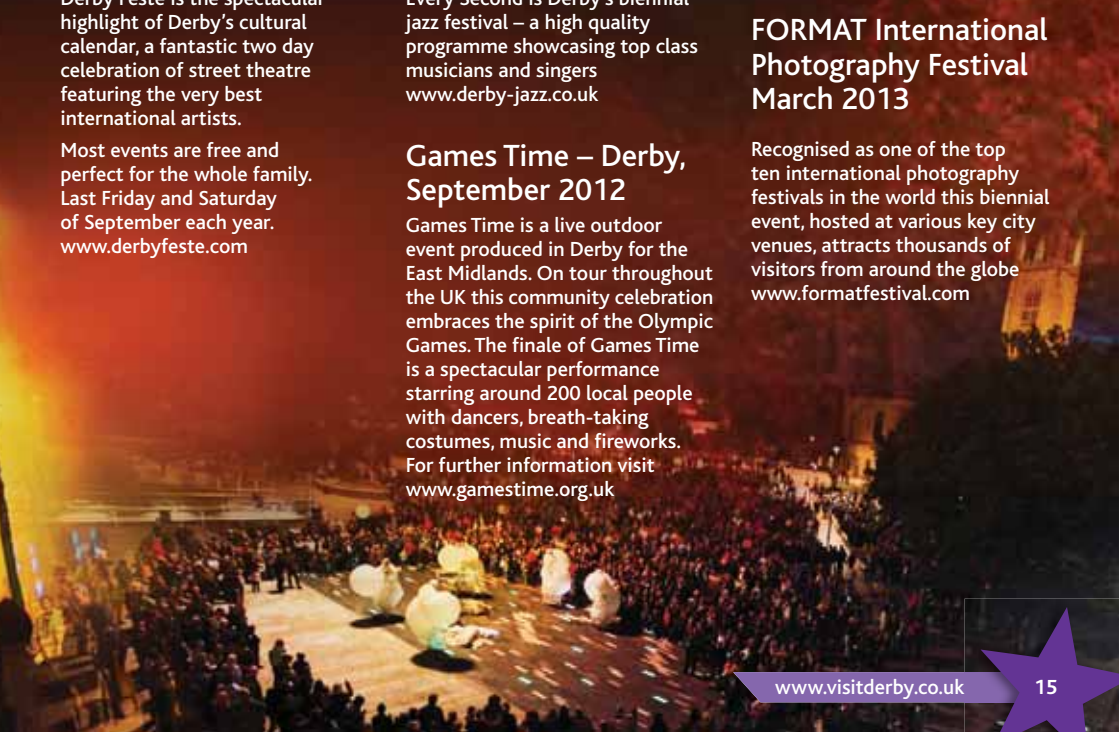
