	Brentwood Borough Council's five-year Corporate Strategy has been approved at full Council. Printed copies of 'Brentwood 2025' were distributed to BBP board members in attendance.

	Businesses will be asked to lend volunteer support to the Spruce Up the High Street campaign in Brentwood, Shenfield and Ingatestone. LE will circulate full details to BBP board members prior to the next BBP meeting. The spruce up project is part of the wider 'Keep Britain Tidy' campaign, where residents and businesses are encouraged to hold community litter picks. Brentwood Borough Council will be lending litter picking kits to groups who want to tidy up their neighbourhoods.	

Send information about Spruce Up the High Street LE **Planning Policy** Brentwood's Local Plan was submitted to the Secretary of State for examination on 14 February 2020. **Corporate Enforcement** The Corporate Enforcement team has continued with its daily patrols concentrating on particular hotspot areas, such as West Horndon, the multi-story car park, Navestock. The Corporate Enforcement team have participated in an Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) and Enforcement Action Week which consisted of targeting particular areas and working on open cases. These patrols have been done out of hours to help tackle noise nuisance, drugs, general ASB and flytipping around Brentwood Station, Woodland Avenue, Blackmore, Pilgrims Hatch and Ingatestone. The patrols will take place every 1-2 months for a whole week as well as weekend patrols. Corporate Enforcement supported Essex Police with a day of action in regard to road traffic offences. The ASB team have also assisted Essex Police on a recent raid. 8. **Business Trade Clusters Updates** Shenfield Both clusters will be working together to organise an Easter egg trail, which will be funded by traders. No BBP bid will be submitted but Brentwood Council will support as a BBP partner by printing posters and entry forms. KT reported that footfall is down due to half term. KT reported on behalf of Nish Patel that Shenfield needs more onstreet parking enforcement. Nish has also raised the matter with ward councillors. 	Baytree Centre DF said that the Baytree Centre is reviewing their Town Link Radio subscription.	
	DF reported that a new independent retailer, Hey Joe, a vinyl record/coffee shop, has opened in the Baytree Centre. There is also a mobile coffee concession. The Ping Pong Parlour has reopened from Monday to Friday (9am-4pm).	
	Brentwood Theatre The Theatre has launched a Community Cinema, which is already attracting sizeable audiences. The Theatre is also working on its Get Into Arts festival, which will be part of the Brentwood/Essex 2020 offer.	
9.	Report on Outcomes on BBP Business Plan
