Easter Fri 22nd April and working week 25th April

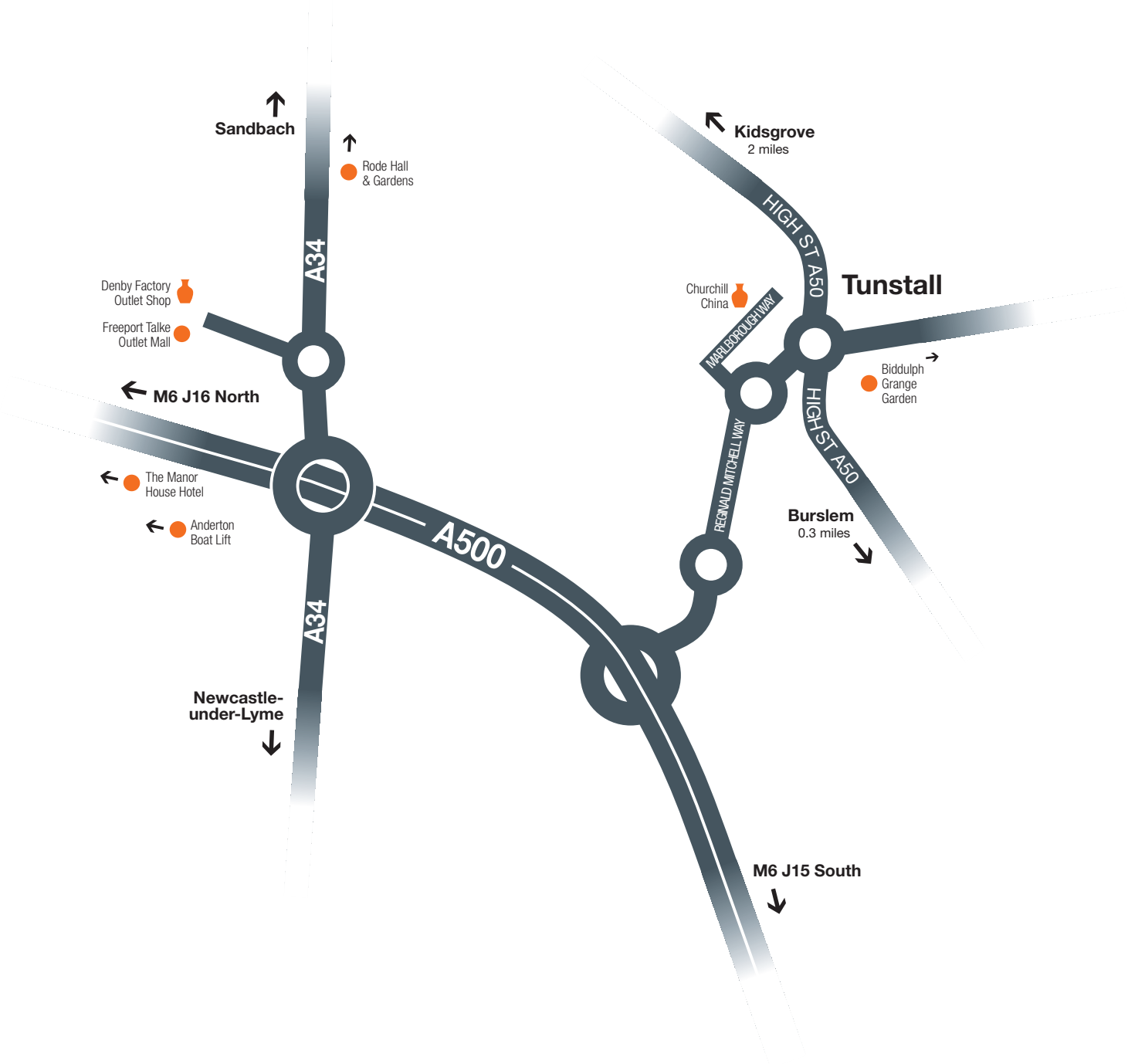

Late Summer Thur 25th August, Fri 26th August and working week of 29th August

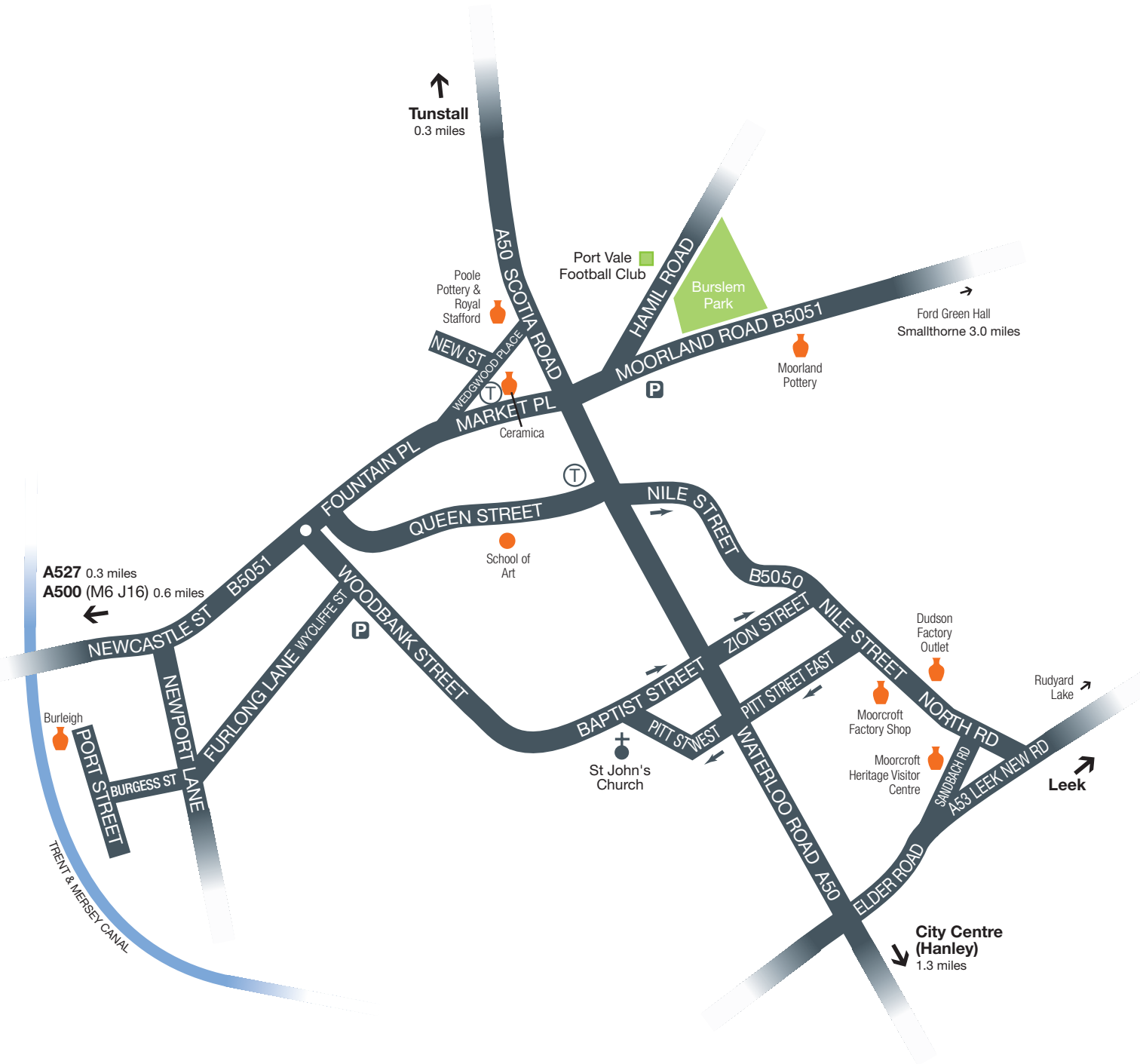

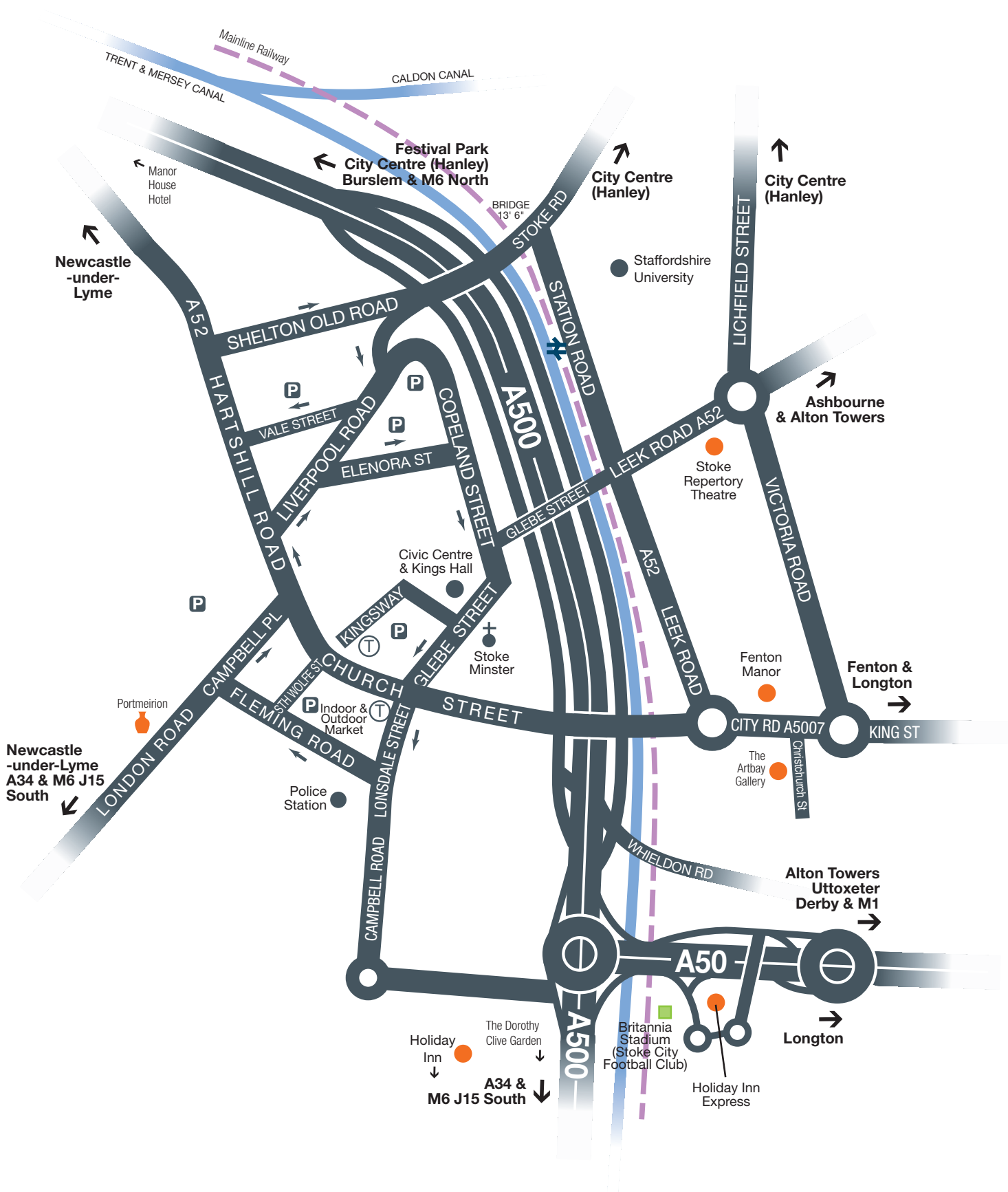
1 North of the City



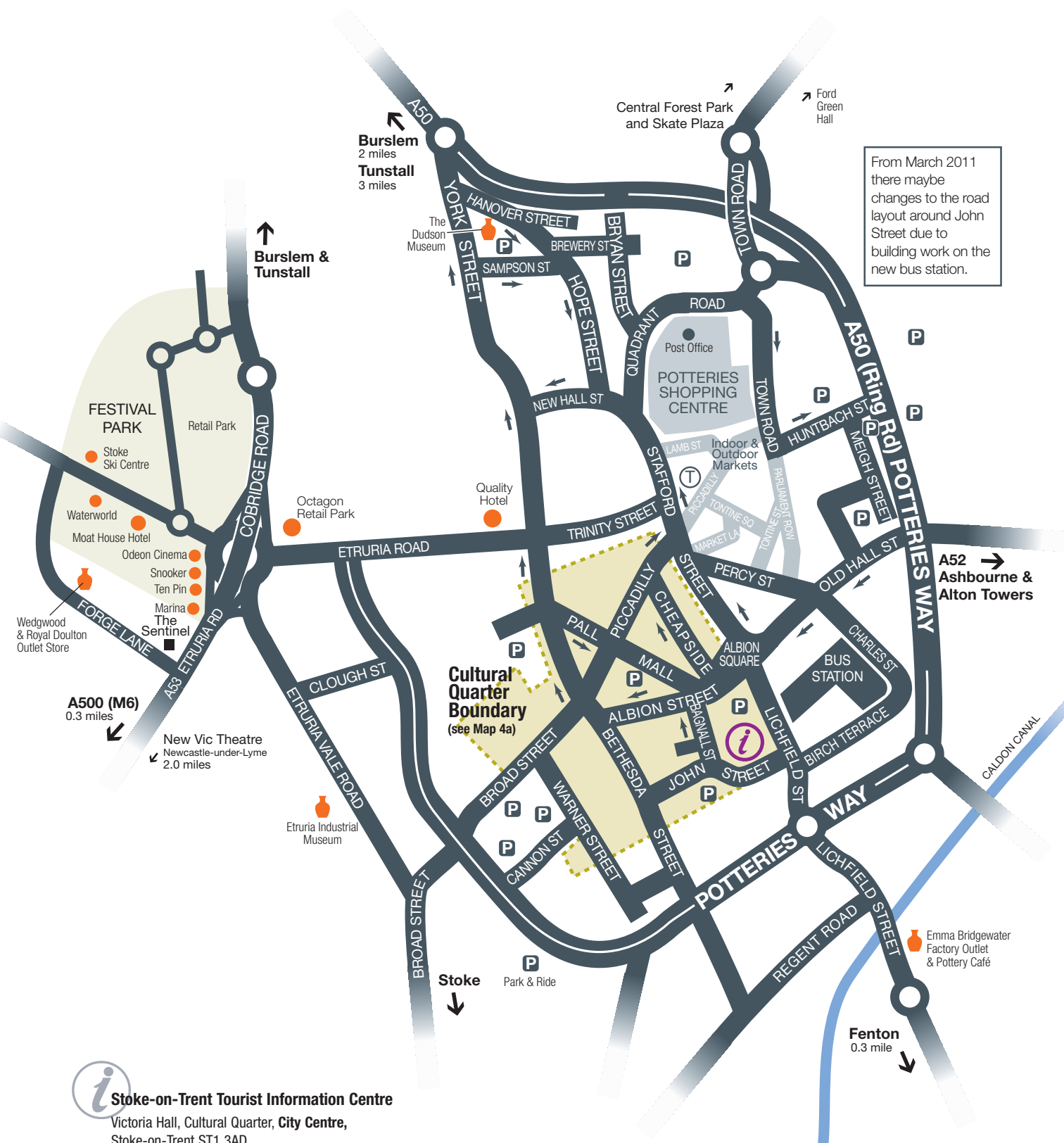
2 North of the City - Burslem

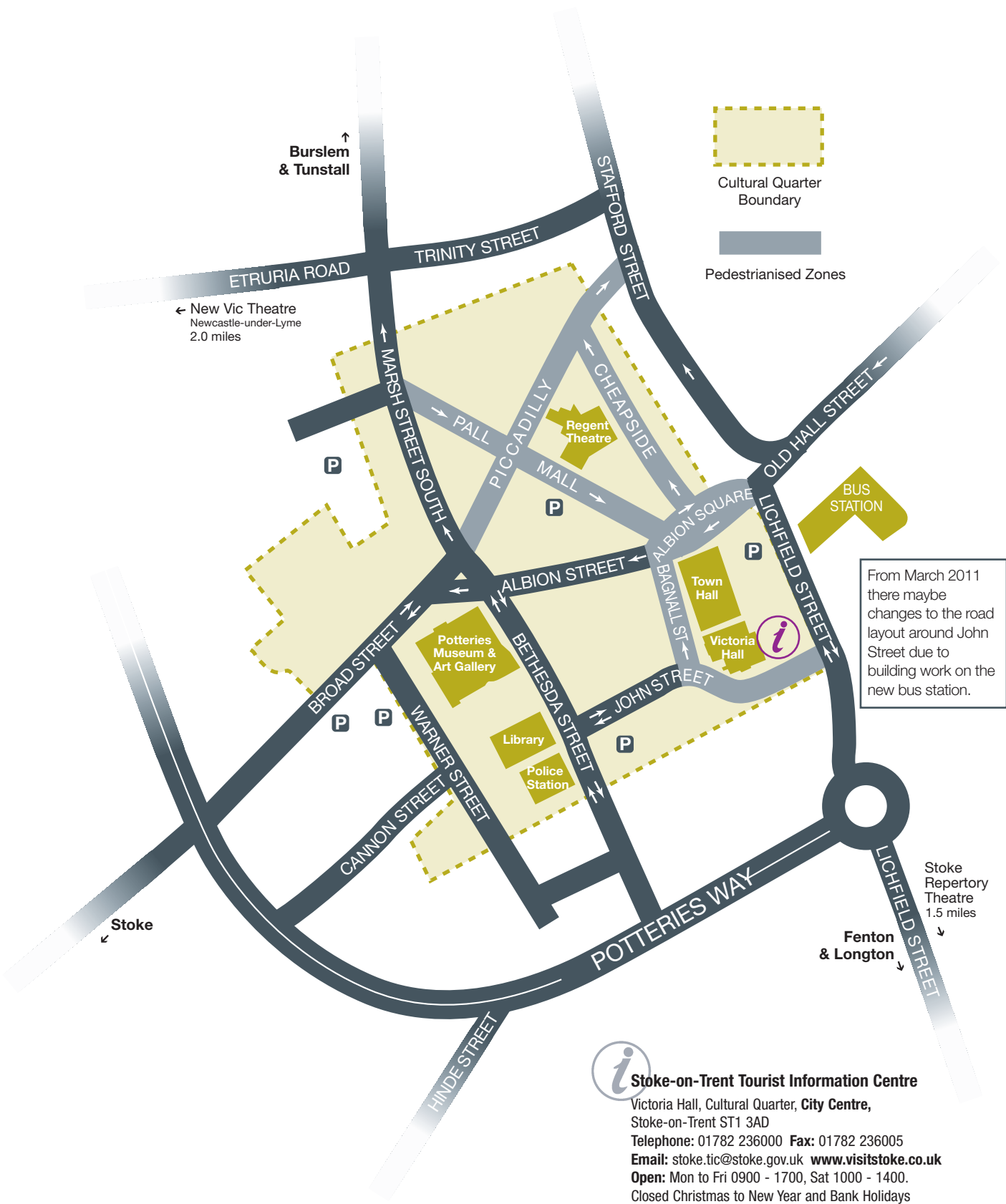
4 City Centre (Hanley) including Festival Park



From March 2011 there may be changes to the road layout around John Street due to building work on the new bus station.

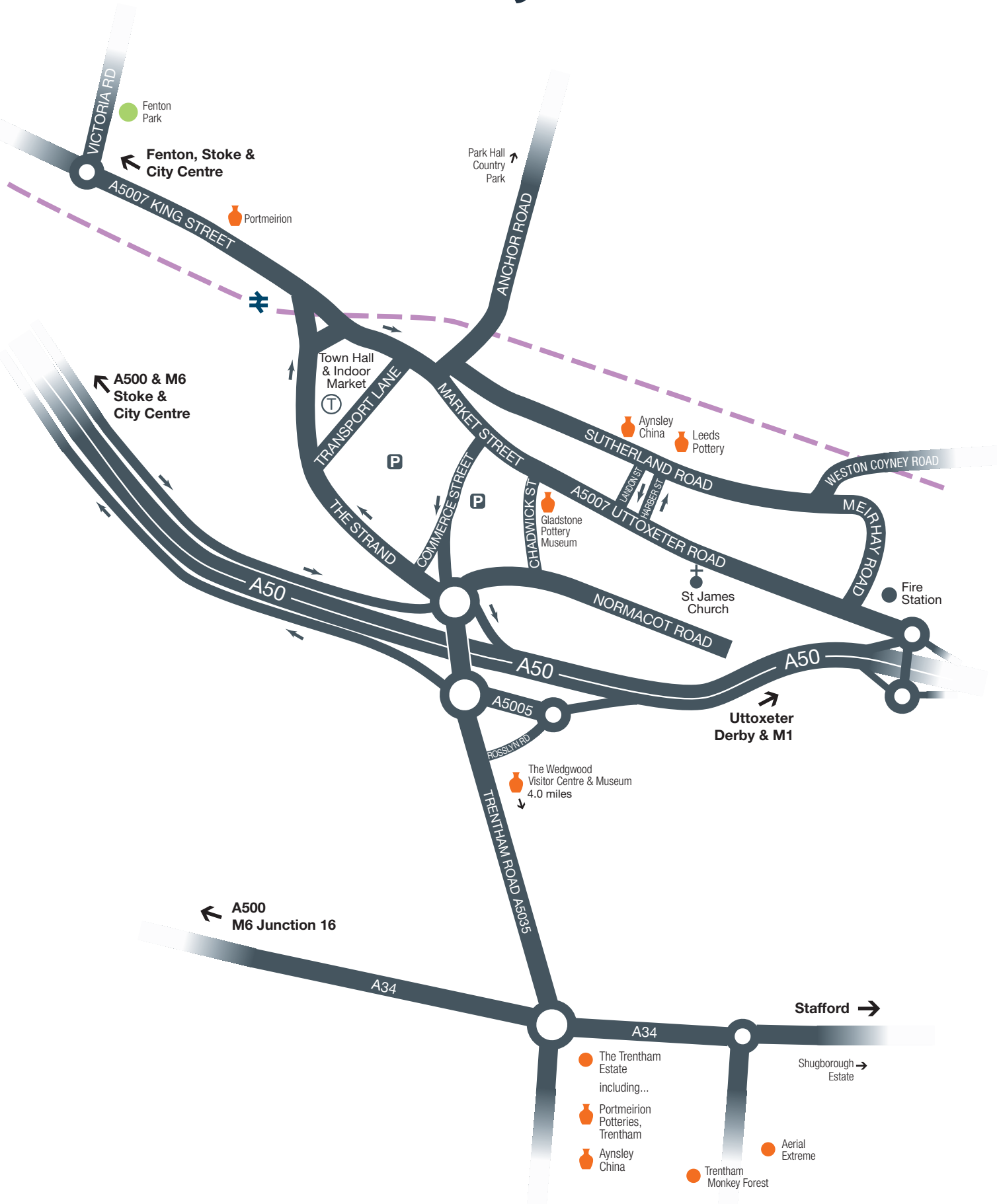
