

Tour de Yorkshire 2019, Stage 4

Stage 4 – Halifax to Leeds

Sunday, 5 May 2019 - Stage 4 of the Tour de Yorkshire 2019 passes through Queensbury, Keelham, Leeming, Haworth, Oakworth and Laycock.

Bearing this in mind, the following traffic and highways information has been put together to support a successful, safe, and enjoyable event.

Traffic and Highways Information **Road closures – Sunday, 5 May 2019**

These will be in place to facilitate the event passing through the district.

From **7am** to **3pm** the following roads will be closed however, where possible roads may open sooner

- Brighthouse Road, Keelham (between Well Heads and Smithy Hill)
- Black Moor Road, Leeming to Haworth
- Brow Road, Haworth (between Victoria Road and Bridgehouse Lane)
- Main Street, Haworth
- Changegate, Haworth
- Mackinginstone Lane, Oakworth
- Holme House Lane, Laycock
- Goose Eye, Laycock
- Game Scar Lane, Laycock

Race publicity caravan

The Tour de Yorkshire Publicity Caravan will pass along the race route on the day of the event. The location and approximate timing for the caravan at Green Lane, Queensbury is **10:55am** and **Haworth at 11:05am**. The caravan will then follow the race route.

Additional information

There will be traffic disruption! Roads will be closed by either the Police using motor cycle outriders or Bradford Council Officers. All roads will have stewards available to help wherever possible.

All temporary closures should last for a maximum of 40 minutes at a time however; this will be dependent on the day's race pace. There will be no signposting for diversion routes as the closures are temporary.

People are advised to plan in advance the journeys they may need to make on the race days, so the least disruption is caused. We also advise that additional time is factored in to any such journeys to allow for possible delays.

In liaison with all the emergency services, we have detailed plans in place to mitigate all eventualities that may occur during the course of the race and closure periods.

All wheelie bins should be placed within the grounds of your property. If wheelie bins are left out on the day of the race, for safety reasons, they will be moved without warning.

Once the race has passed, normal traffic conditions will resume.

If you are approaching the rear of the race you should not attempt to overtake the escort vehicles under any circumstances.

Parking on the route

Residents and visitors to the area are requested to park their vehicles off the main race route on the race days. For safety purposes, this will enable the riders to take full advantage of the space available to them as well as the added benefit of enabling a better spectator view.

Signs will be placed in particularly narrow areas as a reminder to keep the route clear. Please note that vehicles parked on the route during the event may be subject to searches by the emergency/security services and/or removal as necessary

Bus services

Bus operators will be running normally services throughout the race events however; some routes may change slightly due to the road closures. For further information on both days of the event please [visit the Metro website](#).
